Intro: Matthew's Gospel speaks to the "post-E" church. Jewish tradition contains exhortation to moderation, toleration, and mercy. But, the Greek word κρινω (krino) is without parallel as a prohibition. Do not "c" or be "c of" Jesus says. Because final judgment is near, and may be tonight.
I. Do NOT Judge = Don't size me up and w me off. Do not judge, or too will be judged. Matthew 7:1 How do you want to be judged? Matthew 7:2 We judge because we are j We judge because we are srighteous (ignorant). Matthew 7:3, Why look at the s in their eye? So that I don't have to d with what's in mine. Matt 7:4, How can you? The answer: N well! Jesus says, "You h,": "Somebody who is more fascinated, interested in, preoccupied with other people than themselves." - Andy Stanley The Lesson: Mind your business!
II. Don't put a period where God puts a c "You hypocrite, f take the p out of your own eye, and you will see c to r the speck" 7:5 First, we must be aware of our own f and God's f, then we can help. Matthew 7:15-17 "Following Jesus ends with 'What's in it for me?" "Judge not but do not stop there." - Andy Stanley
III. L One Another. Judge Not does NOT equate to: C not, a not, react not or mind my own business. L forbids me to size you up and write you L forbids me to size you up and walk Matt 18:15
Action Steps for Three Audiences: 1. You size people up and write them off. R 2. You size people up and walk away. C 3. You've been sized up, but you refuse to listen. L !

WHAT NOT TO DO IT'S GOOD FOR YOU!

Matthew 7: 1-2, 12-14, 28-29 (NRSV)

Do not judge, so that you may not be judged. For with the judgment you make you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get.

In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets.
