One of the Great Turning Points in the History of the Church – Acts 10
"For the first time, a Gentile is to be admitted into its fellowship." – William Barclay
Cornelius was a centurion stationed at Caesarea.
The cohort was what we might call a battalion, made up of men.
He was devout, feared God, generously, prayed constantly, but was not Jewish.
Cornelius was known as a <i>God-fearer</i> who did not accept circumcision or the law, but attended synagogue and believed in one God and pure ethic of Jewish religion.
Peter Prays

Peter invited them and gave them lodging!
The next day they travel miles north to a Roman centurion's house.
